UW Staff Members Back Civil Defense Show Next Week

Students and faculty and civil service staff members of the University of Wisconsin will have a first hand opportunity along with other Madison residents to see "the show that may save" their lives in the field house Monday through Wednesday.

The show is the national civil defense "Alert America Convoy" coming to the Wisconsin campus under the sponsorship of the state Office of Civil Defense.

President E. B. Fred and commandants of all military services are on the campus: Col. Winfred G. Skelton, Army ROTC; Capt. Robert E. Blue, Navy ROTC; and Lt. Col. Glenn A. Stell, Air ROTC; have joined 33 prominent Madison citizens who are serving as honorary sponsors of the convoy.

Thousands of residents of Madison and Dane county are expected to join with the university community residents in viewing the display of 22 civil defense exhibits which make up the show.

"This is the show that may save your life" is the slogan adopted for the convoy to emphasize the importance of the need for civil defense and the part each individual citizen may play in it.

In addition to the 22 exhibits in the convoy, there will be additional

exhibits showing the role of fire departments, the Red Cross, trucking firms, the telephone company, and other public and private groups in civil defense.

The Alert America Convoy show will be open to the general public following a special ribbon cutting ceremony at 7:30 p. m. Monday and from 10 a. m. to 9 p. m. on Tuesday and Wednesday.
