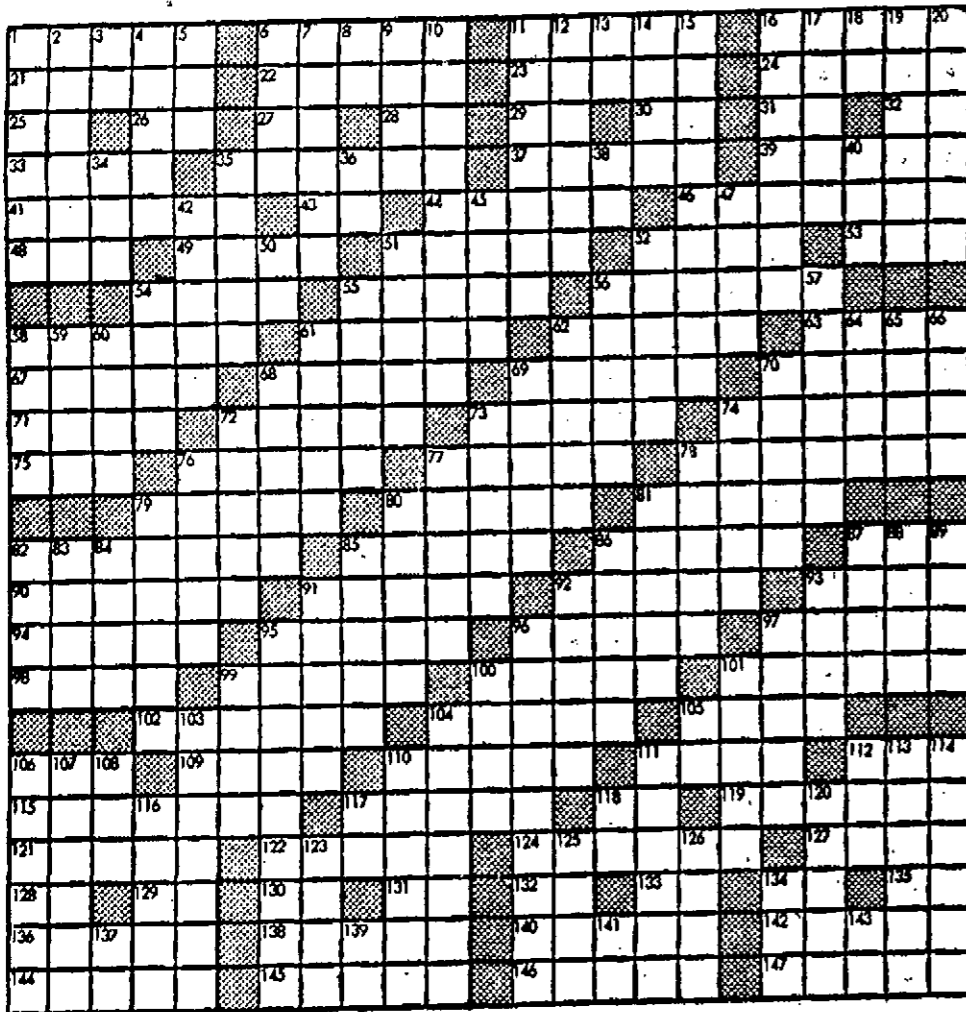
Dinosaur Eggs Were Small

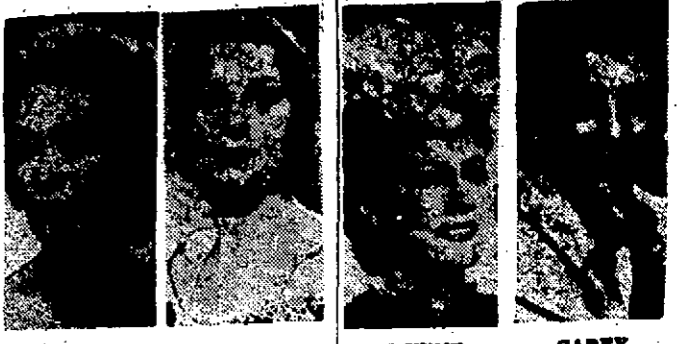
