MADISON'S Cardinals are among four barbershop quartets chosen by the U. S. department of defense to visit bases in Alaska, Austria, Germany, and Korea this summer.

The Cardinals will leave Madison July 18 or 19 for Austria, via Westover Air base at Chicopee Falls, Mass. Last July, the quartet helped inaugurate this army recreation service by going to Alaska to show soldiers how to organize barbershop singing groups.

This year, the men will be the first such organization to carry the lessons to Austrian posts. Their job will be to show servicemen how to form quartets, rehearse, and appear in public. They will take with them such equipment as pitch-pipes and music—the former because few posts have pianos or other instruments with more or less permanent tuning.

The Cardinals will leave Westover by plane July 21 and will return to that base Aug. 3.

In the meantime, they will compete for international honors at the annual barbershop quartet contest in Kansas City, Mo., on June 13 and 14. They qualified in regional competition May 17 at Waukesha.

The Cardinals will be among scores of quartets seeking the championship now held by the Schmitt brothers of Two Rivers, Wis. Members of the Madison quartet are Jerry Ripp, lead; Joseph L. Ripp, tenor; Vaughn Liscum, baritone, and Philip M. Davies, bass.

The Schmitt brothers also will be among the flying missionaries of music this year. They will go to Alaskan bases. The Buffalo Bills of Buffalo, N. Y., have been chosen for the Korean trip and the Clef Dwellers of Detroit, Mich., for a trip to Germany.

Her father is dean of the university school of education. Her mother formerly was leading woman with the Al Jackson Players at the Garrick (now the Madison) theater, where she played opposite Melvyn Douglas and Ralph Bellamy.

Common Council City Woman, Parents Get \$1,269 Crash Award

A Circuit Court jury awarded \$1,269 late Wednesday afternoon to Mrs. Phyllis Opprecht, 3449 Richard st., and her parents, Mr. and Mrs. R. Wesley Elliott, Dodgeville, for injuries they received in a traffic accident Mar. 11, 1951, on the Verona rd.

Defendants in the trial were Howard Ralsbeck, 1837 Sheridan st., driver of the car which struck the car driven by Mrs. Opprecht's husband, Rudy G., a foreman at Oscar Mayer and Co., and the insurers of Opprecht's car, the Employers Liability Co.

The jury found that Ralsbeck was 100 per cent negligent in causing the accident. They awarded \$525 to Mrs. Opprecht, \$355 to Mrs. Elliott, and \$200 to Elliott.

Atty Hugh F. Oldenburg represented Oscar Mayer and Co., and the Elliotts. Atty W. L. Jackson represented the defendants.
