


No Bids Entered for Water Mains; City to Readvertise

Madison may have to lay its own water mains this year unless re-advertisement of bids turns up an available contractor. Supt. Leon A. Smith reported Monday.

Bids were to have been opened Monday for 25,000 feet of water mains as the estimateed total of this year's requirements, but there were no bidders. Smith informed the Board of Public Works.

"It's the first time this has hap pened in the history of the Water Department," he said. "Apparent-ly Madison contractors have all the work they can handle this

year."
The board approved Smith's suggestion that new bids be advertised and specifications sent to contractors outside the city. The new bids will be opened June 23.
So far 15,000 feet of water mains have been ordered in for 1952. Smith reported. The city lays about 5 miles of main annually.
