FIVE YEARS AGO THIS month, six girls fresh out of the armed forces met in Madison as the nucleus of an all-girl drum and bugle corps which was to develop into a full-fledged entertainment unit consisting of a 26-piece orchestra and a 32-voice chorus.

The girls were organized originally as a merchandising unit for a packing company. The girls joined an American Legion post at Austin, Minn., and their employer began building up the marching musical unit.

Permanent employment was offered all of them, but only 21 were able to accept, and they became special representatives for the food company.

Gradually, the unit grew to its present stature—a complete entertainment outfit which does a half-hour show—"Music With the Girls"—on the CBS network every Saturday.

Next Saturday's broadcast will be recorded Thursday night at the Capitol theater. Admission will be invitation only. The show will be given here for retail food dealers of the area and their families and friends.

Besides the orchestra and chorus, the two-hour program will include music by the Rainbow trio, marimba soloist Dolores Spitzer, other soloists, and a Dixieland unit; comedy acts, dancing, and other specialties.

DISC OF THE DAY: An unusual combination marks this David Rose recording (MGM). One side has Woody Herman as soloist in "Harlem Nocturne" with a rich backing by Rose's strings. The other has "On a Little Country Road in Switzerland," a novelty complete with yodeling, sound effects, and the Rose strings.

Jane Russell and Victor Mature will be teamed again in "Split Second." Filming is scheduled to start July 7.

Marilyn Monroe is "cover girl of the month." She's on June covers of four magazines—Look, See, Vue, and People Today.

Duke Kahanamoku, sheriff of Honolulu and former Olympic swimming champion, will have a top role in "Big Jim McLain," to be filmed in Hawaii. John Wayne and Nancy Olson will co-star.

WILL ROGERS' SON: Will Rogers, Jr., has shown considerable improvement since his first and only other acting job 20 years ago, his school drama teacher, Mrs. Grace Barnes, said when she recently visited Will on the set of Warner Bros.' production, "The Story of Will Rogers."

"You must have been practicing, Will," she said proudly after watching him play a scene with co-star Jane Wyman.

Mrs. Barnes, now retired, guided young Rogers through a couple of years of dramatic classes at Beverly Hills high school.

"His only stage appearance was in 'Seventeen,' the Booth Tarkington play," she said. "And I must say he wasn't bad for an amateur. He's better now, though."

Will played the lead in "Seventeen," after which he decided he preferred newspapers to acting, and forthwith abandoned his acting career and started editing the school paper. At Leland Stanford, he kept his public appearances limited to the debate and polo teams, both of which he captained. Then upon graduation he bought the Beverly Hills Citizen, which he has been editing and publishing ever since.

"I never had a chance to reconsider acting until Warners offered me this job in Dad's film biography," Rogers said.

As far as his starring appearance in "Seventeen" is concerned, Will reported that inasmuch as there were only about a dozen students in the drama class, it was no evidence of his talent that he appeared in the play.

"As I remember, it took the whole class to fill up the cast," he said.

"That isn't true, Will," admonished Mrs. Barnes. "You were a good actor then, too."
