FIVE YEARS AGO THIS month, six girls fresh out of the armed forces met in Madison as the nucleus of an all-gir drum and bugle corps which was to develop into a full fledged entertainment unit consisting of a 26-piece orchestra and a 32-voice chorus. The -

group will be back in Madison this week.

The girls were organized originally as a merchandising 🦃 unit for a packing company. The girls joined an American Legion post at Austin, Minn., and their employer began building up the marching musical unit. By August, 1947, it had 65 members-all former members of the WAVES, WAC, SPARS, and Marines. They drilled for a month, then entered competition at an American Legion convention.

Permanent employment was offered all of them, but only 21 were able to accept, and they became special representatives for the food company.






