A GROUP OF TEEN-AGE international students on a 21-day traveling scholarship tour of the United States will be interviewed by Jack Bainter over WIBA and WIBA-FM Wednesday at 7:30 p.m.

The Methodist Youth fellowship of Madison has arranged for the visit of these European students, who have been attending American high schools during the past year under the auspices of the American Field service.

The 35 students will arrive by bus on Wednesday afternoon, and will go to Hoyt park for a picnic supper. There they will meet the families who will provide lodging for them during their stay here.

On Thursday morning, the students will visit the capitol and be greeted by Gov. Walter Kohler. The host families will provide sightseeing tours during the afternoon, and several informal parties are planned for the evening to enable the visitors to meet representatives of local youth groups.

The students will leave Madison Friday morning for Kenosha.

A round-table discussion program from the National Hi-Y Congress and conference of Boy Governors in Washington, D. C., will be broadcast over WIBA Saturday at 3:45 p.m.

The discussion topic will be "There Ought To Be A Law." Ted Silvey, deputy assistant administrator of the offices of Labor, National Production Authority, and member of the national board of the Y. M. C. A., will be moderator.

Participants will be Patricia Powle, president of the State Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y council of New Hampshire; Donald Simmons, boy governor of Oklahoma, and Ronald Apperson, boy governor of California.

A program from the 43rd annual convention of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People will be broadcast by WIBA Sunday at 10:45 a.m.

Walter White, executive secretary of the organization, will speak in Oklahoma City, where the convention will be held from June 24 to June 29.

TRUE STORY: "Carbine Williams," James Stewart's new starring picture, is the story of David Marshall Williams, inventor of the carbine rifle which Gen. Douglas MacArthur said was one of the greatest contributing factors in American victory in the Pacific.

The truth about Williams' background became public only a year or so ago. He decided that his son, then 13, should know the whole story before hearing it from unreliable, second-hand sources. The tale was published in newspapers, and it reached Hollywood's attention.

In brief, this is the story: Williams was convicted of second-degree murder after a federal agent was killed in a raid on a still. He was sentenced to 30 years at hard labor.

In a work camp, where he had been sent as "incorrigible," he won the friendship of the warden. Before long, the warden was allowing Williams to draw rough designs of a gun of a revolutionary nature. Then he put the prisoner in charge of the blacksmith shop and permitted him to build the rifle from scraps.

After eight years' imprisonment, Williams won a full pardon. In the 22 years since his release, his 63 patents—many of them on inventions of prison days—have made him a millionaire.

In the movie, Stewart plays Williams, Jean Hagen is his loyal wife, and Wendell Corey is the warden.
