Spread 'Too Thin,' Gen. Weyland Says

WASHINGTON-(UP)--Lt. Gen. Otto P. Weyland, Far East Air Forces commander, asserted Tuesday that America is not making adequate efforts to meet the Rus-sian challenge in the air.

He said in a message from Tok-He said in a message from Tok-yo on the second anniversary of the Koreon War that the free world's air power is spread "dan-gerously thin." Referring to his own theater, Weyland said the Reds have more jet planes than he has although his planes of all types are flying 10 times as many " daily missions.

daily missions. At the same time Adm. DeWitt C. Ramsey, president of the Air-craft Industries Association, dis-closed the United States has built 9.000 to 9,500 military planes since the Korean War started. He said that was half the number that could have been produced "under the stimulus of full production." Weyland and Ramsey made their comments in articles in "Flanes," monthly publication of the aircraft industry.
