ADD ANOTHER WISCONSIN summer theater to your list: the Tower Ranch Tenthouse. The company, now in its fourth season, does its shows arena-style in its theater on the shores of Sugar Camp lake, 14 miles north of Rhinelander and 12 miles south of Eagle River, off Highway 17.

Shows are given at 8:40 p.m. daily except Mondays and Fridays. An extra performance will be given Labor Day.

This week's offering will be "The Corn Is Green," to be followed by "Peg of My Heart," "Hay Fever," "Death of a Salesman," "The Happy Time," "O Mistress Mine," "A Wake, My Little Ones," "Come Back, Little Sheba," "Pygmalion," and "Over 21."

"A Wake, My Little Ones" is an original by Gil Pearlman of Columbia university, completed last winter. It is being considered for both Broadway and Hollywood production.

The play will be presented July 31 through Aug. 9, except for Sunday, Aug. 3. Current attraction is "Goodbye, My Fancy," to be followed by "The Willow and I," which will open July 17.

Michigan Delegates Coy About Polling Their GOP Choice

CHICAGO — Michigan's uncommitted 46-member Republican delegation dodged any attempt to poll sentiment between forces of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower and Sen. Robert A. Taft Sunday at its first caucus.

Principal action during the three-hour meeting was re-election of Arthur E. Summerfield, Flint, as national committeeman and Mrs. Rae C. Hooker, Mt. Pleasant, as national committeewoman. Neither was opposed and their re-election was unanimous.

Summerfield said the group voted support of his stand in the National Committee on contested delegations. Except in the case of Louisiana, Summerfield generally voted in favor of seating Eisenhower delegations from disputed Southern states. The uncommitted and uncommitted Michigan delegation of 46 thus far has not been polled officially on how members will line up between Taft and Eisenhower.

Summerfield said "a substantial number" of the Michigan group are still undecided.

Summerfield said he will seek harmony between Taft and Eisenhower supporters and that he planned further conferences with leaders, including Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, to push his harmony proposal.




