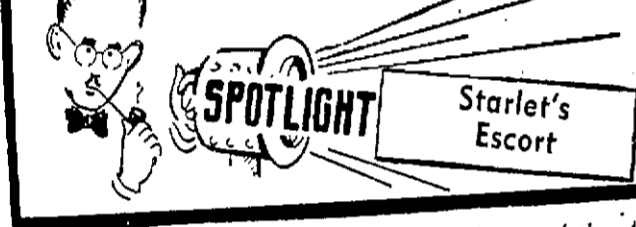

U. W. Experiment Station Field Day Set for Thursday

Thousands of Madison area farmers are expected to attend the University of Wisconsin's experiment station farm field day program Thursday on the West Hill farm.

Specialists at the college of agriculture who planned this year's event said that the program would emphasize small grain research. There will be different grain varieties, plots showing the effects of different cultural practices, a demonstration of the forage harvester-thresher method of grain harvest, and demonstrations on how to control grain diseases.

Along with the indoor exhibits and field demonstrations there will be a woman's program for the
