Two Changes Announced in Photo Contest

Two important changes in the "This is Wisconsin" photo contest were announced this week by Joseph Mercedes, director of the Wisconsin Tourist Bureau.

Also the Fall division which was to have been for pictures submitted between Oct. 1 and Dec. 31 has been eliminated and the Summer division—extended to Oct. 31—will close the contest.

Entries submitted for the Spring contest now must be postmarked by July 31. Entries submitted for the Summer contest must be postmarked by Oct. 31.

Persons who wish to compete for the two remaining seasonal awards may receive entry blanks by writing to Wisconsin Tourist Bureau, Postoffice Box 332, Madison, Wis.

Rules of the contest and place for entry of name, address, etc., are included in the entry blanks. All winners of seasonal contests are eligible for the grand prizes totaling \$4,000.

Any person—professional or amateur—is eligible. The only stipulation is that the pictures be taken within the times prescribed by the seasonal contests.

A book, "This is Wisconsin" will include 160 of the contest's prize winning photos.
