

Arturo Toscanini reached New York last Wednesday after flying alone (for the first time) from Milan, Italy. Before opening his new season with the NBC Symphony on Nov. 1, he will make several records with that orchestra, return to Milan to conduct concerts, and go to London for two concerts with the Philharmonic orchestra.

Dinah Shore has signed a long-term contract with NBC. **J. Scott Smart** commutes by air from Oganquit, Me., to New York for his weekly "Top Guy" broadcasts on ABC.

Kathi Norris, of NBC's "Anybody Home," has been invited to prepare a series of lectures on American homemaking methods for the University of London.

Jim Backus, former radio and night club comedian, will play a prosecuting attorney in "The Murder" for RKO Radio pictures.

Polly Graus, Samuel Goldwyn's script girl on "Hans Christian Andersen," is a member of the U. S. women's fencing team which will compete in the Olympic games.

TIME CHANGE: To avoid playing in the peak heat of the day, the All-State High school band will give its outdoor concert at 4 p. m. Sunday on the Memorial Union terrace. The program had been planned for 3 p. m.

DISC OF THE DAY: Straight forward and careful, if unemotional, delivery characterizes **Eleanor Sobor's** collection "Sacred Arias," for Columbia. Mendelssohn's "Hear Ye, Israel" is by far the best of the set; others are "With Verdure Clad," "I Know That My Redeemer Liveth," "My Heart Ever Faithful," and "Weinen Klagen."

RECORD CARE: William S. Bachman, director of engineering and development for Columbia Records, gives these basic rules for handling LPs in an article in High Fidelity magazine:

ONE. Always handle a long playing record by its edges or by one edge and center. Since fingertips are normally greasy, fingerprints on record surfaces will attract dust and gritty particles, eventually producing irritating surface noise.

TWO. Buckle the record jacket when removing or replacing, an LP disc to permit handling the record by its edge and sliding it easily into the container. Records should always be put back into their jackets immediately after each playing. LPs should not be left to lie around unprotected.

THREE. Before playing, wipe the LP record lightly with a soft, slightly damp cloth to pick up dust. This will reduce static electricity which would attract particles from the air while the record is being played.

FOUR. Store albums vertically and single LPs either an edge or flat in stacks. Records should be stored absolutely flat, but multiple-disc sets or albums should not be mixed in horizontal stacks with single records. The variation in thickness will cause warpage. Proper storage is the most important preventative for record warpage. Also keep records away from radiators or other sources of heat.

Bachman suggests also that record users watch closely for signs of needle wear. A worn-out needle is a menace to LP records, causing considerable damage to record playing surfaces. Frequently record surface noise and poor reproduction result from using a badly-worn stylus.
