

 CHICAGO — (AP) — A woman identified as Mrs. Margaret Pierre, aged 55, of Janesville, Wis., plunged to her death from her 10th floor room in the Drake hotel Sunday.  
 Police said they checked the only room with a screen missing and found the door locked from the inside. They found the screen in the room, a suitcase of clothing and a purse containing \$11. No notes or letters were found.  
 Dr. J. Roscoe Harry, who had treated Mrs. Pierre and who identified the body, said she was a practical nurse unable to work because of a heart attack which left her with a brain injury.  
 Dr. Harry, who said Mrs. Pierre was 52, said she occasionally was unable to see her arms and legs and lately had become dependent over her condition.

**RFC Launches Big Search for Better Synthetic Rubber**

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Reconstruction Finance Corp. (RFC) has launched a \$5,500,000 search for better types of synthetic rubber.  
 RFC Administrator Harry A. McDonald announced the research program will be concentrated in the fiscal year which began July 1.  
 The major aim: to improve the quality of synthetic rubber for more extensive use in large-size tires, to improve the quality of cold rubber latex, and to aid in the search for improved synthetic rubber for special national defense purposes.  
 The research was authorized by Congress to keep the government-owned synthetic rubber industry in an advanced state adequate for defense and essential civilian needs.  
 So far, the industry has turned up such products as cold rubber—so named because it is produced at low (41 degrees, Fahrenheit) temperatures—which can be made into tires giving better tread wear than natural rubber, and oil-masticated GR-S (general purpose rubber).  
 The latter, an important recent product, shown a 10 to 20 per cent improvement in tread wear performance over cold GR-S, and at a "substantial reduction in cost," because relatively inexpensive oils are used to stretch out the hard rubber also used.
