

Leo Steffens heeded Schumann in his recital at Music ha Wednesday night, and with his playing added to it the ad monition that the pianist should not scorn the short piece, either. If one counts the eight sections of Schumann's "Fantasie stucke" individually, Steffens had 17 numbers on his 80-minute pro

gram. Each, at his hands, was a gem-each with a different set of facets a different color, a different texture from its fellows,

The Schumann work opened the recital with its own contrasts Some of the parts were quict and slow, some were powerful and fast all were dynamic. Some-notably "Grillen"-served to show th warmth of tone which Steffens can give his music.

Then came the intricate "Arabesque No. 1" of Debussy, an early place which concisely told his intimate knowledge of the instrument and the same composer's delightful "Polssons d'Or" from his second set of "Images." Faure's almost impassioned "Impromptu in A-Fla Major" closed first half of the program.

Rachmaninoss and Ravel made up the second portion, empha sizing the latter's mastery of musical understatement in comparison with the full-bodied drama of the Russian.




