"A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM" has been chosen by the Milwaukee Players for presentation at the Children's Theater Conference session here Aug. 23. The organization will give an outdoor performance in Milwaukee on Aug. 20. Robert E. Freidel will direct the show.

'JOHN BROWN'S BODY': Judith Anderson, Tyrone Power, and Raymond Massey will be the principals of a dramatic reading of "John Brown's Body" which will reach the Milwaukee Auditorium on Nov. 26 during a nationwide tour. Charles Laughton has adapted the Benet poem for production and is directing the cast. Walter Schumann's singing and speaking chorus will be used. Miss Anderson will visit 80 cities in "Medea" after the "John Brown's Body" tour.

CONCERT: Here is the complete program of the concert which the University of Wisconsin Summer Symphony orchestra will give at 8 p. m. Sunday in Music Hall: "Sonata No. 9 ('Golden Sonata)," Purcell-Elkan; "Symphony No. 5 ('Reformation)," Mendelssohn; Prelude to "Irmelin," Darius; "Concerto No. 2 for Piano and Orchestra," Rachmaninoff. Prof. Richard C. Church will conduct and Marjorie Loberg will be soloist. Admission will be free.

MUSIC FOR DANCING: Bob Arden's orchestra played for dancing at the Wisconsin School for Girls, Oregon, Saturday night under a grant from the recording industry's performance fund.

ART LECTURES: Members of the Madison Art Assn. have been invited to attend two lectures this week at the University of Wisconsin, to be given under auspices of the art education department. Buckminster Fuller will speak on "Comprehensive Designing" at 8 p. m. Wednesday in the Wisconsin Union theater and Italo de Francesco on "Major Issues in Art Education" at 9 a. m. Thursday in Great hall of the Memorial Union.

'PICK THE WINNER': A program which was plugged so heavily on the CBS convention broadcasts, "Pick the Winner" will begin Sunday and will end Nov. 2—just before election day. It will present spokesmen of both major parties, answering questions on issues asked by members of studio audiences. Dwight Cooke will be moderator.

INVITATION: Because it feels that everyone should enjoy the riches of music and its lore, the University of Wisconsin school of music faculty has issued a blanket invitation to all on the campus to use the music library facilities.

"You don't have to be in music school," Chairman Leland Coon explained. "There is a chemistry faculty member who haunts our opera shelves, and a wide assortment of students can be found listening to records any day."

Day and evening summer hours are posted on the doors of the two music hall libraries open to the public. Most popular is the Carnegie library, which houses a huge collection of records to suit the taste of any listener, as well as musical scores and books, many of which can be checked out.

The Mills library, created in honor of the late Dr. Charles H. Mills, a former music school director, contains abundant source material—scores, periodicals, and books.

Miniature scores of operas, chamber music, and symphonies are available. Keyboard and organ music, vocal sets, and the complete works of such masters as Handel, Bach, Beethoven, Brahms, Lully, and Couperin can be found.

The rarest finds are in a section not open to the public, but those interested may arrange to microfilm any part of the collection, Coon said.

On the locked shelves reposes one of the two existing photostats of the first book ever printed on the origin of music, Viridung's "Musica Getuschl." There are also photostats of a rare collection of American folk songs and complete sets in microfilm of such rarities as the works of Rameau, the original orchestral score of Schumann's "Spring Symphony," and "Deutsche Kunst in Oesterreich."
