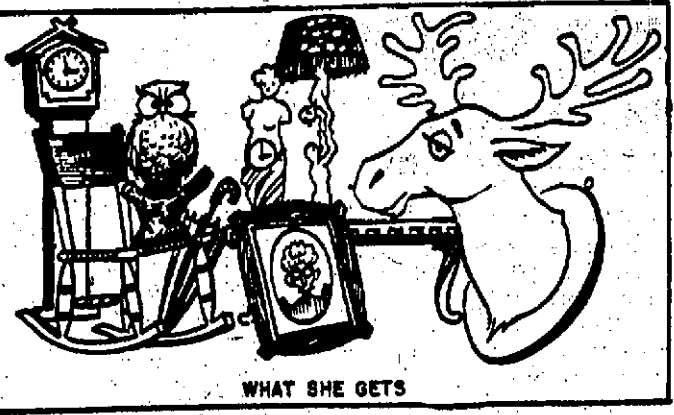

News from Broadway

TIP O' THE MORNING: Latest report from Radio City (according to Radio Television Daily) is that "The Big Show," starring Tallulah Bankhead, will not be back on NBC this fall. Other sources say the same.

"ROOM SERVICE," last week's Wisconsin Players choice, will become a musical comedy with Phil Silvers starring. Silvers' last Broadway chore was "Top Banana," which he left for a vacation and which folded 16 performances later.

New York hears that the new Lunt-Fontanne play, "Quadrille," is a London hit. Peter Capell is in Europe negotiating for stage rights to "The Diary of a Young Girl," "Love Is the Doctor," based on two Moliere plays, will be a Fall musical offering. It was written and composed by Robert Wright and George Forrest, who did the same for "Song of Norway."

Jimmy Van Heusen is writing the music and Johnny Burke the lyrics for "Carnival in Flanders," by George Oppenheimer—based on the French film of the same name. Jerome Robbins will be choreographer for the Bette Davis revue, "Two's Company."

Other openings, more or less definite: "Kind Sir," comedy by Norman Krasna; "In Any Language, comedy by Edmund Beloin and Henry Garson, Oct. 8; "The Time of the Cuckoo," by Arthur Laurents, Oct. 15; "The Trial of Mr. Pickwick," in September; "Those Familiar Spirits," by Arthur Miller; Miriam Hopkins and Peter Lorre in "A Night at Mme. Tussaud's."

TODAY'S LAUGH: Georgie Price, host of CBS' "Big Time," tells of two Irish housewives who were working on the roof of a 9-story building and lost their balance and fell. The larger of the two managed to get his pick stuck in the cornice, and the smaller man grabbed his feet. And there they hung, nine stories above the pavement. But soon the big man, clinging to the pick, got tired and shouted down, "Let go of me lags." The little man, hanging on for dear life, shouted back, "I will not." The big one threatened: "Let go of me lags, or I'll hit ye over the head with this pick."

PRODUCER: Edmond O'Brien, whom Madison knew briefly as a Truax Field student and who played at the Parkway theater in Orson Welles' "Julius Caesar," plans to become an independent film producer and director this year, he announced while starting in filmakers "The Difference." He intends to film several stories co-authored with his brother, Liam O'Brien. While he has never before attempted picture directing, the star staged "Farnell" and "Bury the Dead" when the Broadway foot-light hits toured the country.

SILVER PINS: Two more counties, and Wisconsin gets a silver pin. Meredith Willson is trying, on his "Music Room" program over NBC, to "uninhibit people about music." He is convinced that "people shouldn't turn pale at the mention of Beethoven's name," and to help the idea along he has devised a "Mystery Melody" feature. It is a classical recording which he plays on the program and asks listeners not to identify, but to write, on letter or postcard, the impressions which the piece conjures up for them.

During the first four weeks in its Sunday night time Willson's "Music Room" received more than 5,000 pieces of mail.

To keep track of his increasing audience, he began a county survey of his listeners. He installed in his office a large wall map of the U.S. and on it he placed flags with the call letters of the various stations carrying the "Music Room."

For each letter he receives he places a blue pin in the county where the listener lives. When each county in a state has been heard from, that state receives a silver pin with a small American flag attached to it. The "Music Room's" county survey now has all 48 states represented, with six states — Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Connecticut, New Jersey, and Delaware — sold out with 100 per cent county representation. The states of Iowa, New York, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Missouri, California, and Wisconsin are close behind, with only one or two counties in each still to be heard from before they receive the silver pins.
