ORCHESTRA: The 125-piece All-State High School orchestra will give a public concert at 4 p. m. Sunday on the Memorial Union terrace. The orchestra, which Victor Kolar conducts, is made up of teen-agers attending the summer music clinic on the University of Wisconsin campus.

The organization will play "Turkish March," Mozart; "Military March," Schubert-Daurosich; first movement of Symphony No. 8 ("Unfinished Symphony"), Schubert; "Crimean Sketches," Sponderov; suite from "Cephal and Proxio," Gretry; overture to "The Yellow Princess," Saint-Saens; "At Dawning," Cadman-Herbert; "To a Water Lily," MacDowell; and "Fair Land of Mine," Kolar.

YOUNG COMPOSERS: An educational project designed to recognize the talents of young contemporary composers has been launched by The National Broadcasting Co. in cooperation with the school of music at Northwestern university.

Works of outstanding student composers, along with those of several Northwestern faculty members, will be presented regularly on "Surprise Serenade," heard weekly on the NBC radio network. Performances of these contemporary works, many of them for the first time publicly, will be conducted by Joseph Gallicchio and the NBC Concert orchestra.

The first student composition to be heard (Saturday at 5:30 p. m. on WMAQ) will be the first movement of a "Suite for Flute, Harp, and String Orchestra" by John Cacavas, a fall senior at Northwestern. The 22-year-old composer from Aberdeen, S. D., is musical director of Northwestern's WJUR, and has composed and arranged for radio and conducted his own dance orchestra.

The project will be under the supervision of Judith Waller, NBC Chicago director of public affairs and education, and George Howerton, dean of the Northwestern school of music, with musical production by Don Marcotte, NBC music supervisor.

MUSIC HATH CHARMS: Mutual sportscaster Al Helfer has one consoling thought that helps him keep relaxed on a hectic seven-day-a-week schedule. He knows he'll hear soothing music when he returns home. Al is married to Ramona, Paul Whiteman's former solo pianist.

AUTUMN TOUR: Red Foley, singing in c. of NBC's "Grand Ole Opry," is being booked for a three-months, coast-to-coast personal appearance tour beginning early this fall.

The redhead, who was starred for two weeks in June at the Astor Roof in New York, will play no additional stage shows this summer. However, beginning about Sept. 1, he and a cast from the "Grand Ole Opry" radio series will be seen at theaters in the larger cities.

Michigan Woman Files \$21,012 Damage Suit

Mary Jean Myers, Marshall, Mich., filed suit in Madison Federal Court Wednesday to collect \$21,012 damages for the death of her husband, Bruce Myers, in a two-car and trailer-tractor collision Feb. 1, 1952, on Highway 51 north of Madison.

Defendants are Emery H. MacMillin, Madison, the Cheesemakers Mutual Casualty Co., Madison; James Nelson, Minneapolis, and the National Butler Co., St. Paul, Nelson's employer. Myers, according to the complaint, was a passenger in a car driven by Robert E. Brown when it was hit by the trailer-tractor driven by Nelson after the tractor had collided with MacMillin's car.

BOOT CAMP DIVIDEND: In a tribute to composer Vincent Youmans on CBS' "Main Street Music Hall," Eddie Gallaher recalled Youmans' first song success, written at the age of 19. Youmans, who had enlisted as a sailor in World War I, was in boot camp, and nothing he had written had been published. But he showed one of his tunes to John Philip Sousa, then bandmaster at the Great Lakes Naval Training station. Sousa liked the piece, played it, passed it along to other Navy bands. Pretty soon sailors all over the country were marching to it. Nine years later, Youmans used it as one of the songs for his show "Hit the Deck." The song was "Hallelujah."
