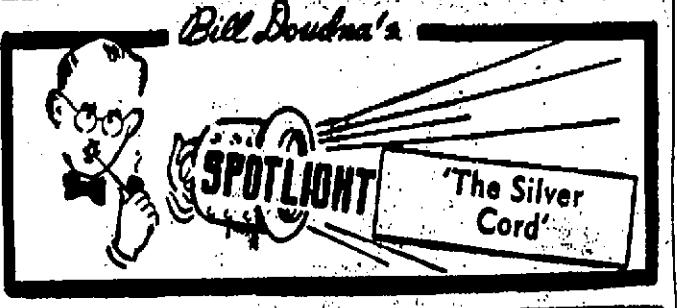

DANCING: The best way to get a job dancing in movies or on television is by studying at a university, says Robbin Gregory...

Miss Gregory returned to the University of Wisconsin this summer to work on her master's degree.

The first university to teach dancing for a degree, the University of Wisconsin is nationally known as "the best dance department in the country," according to Miss Gregory.

"There has been a strong trend toward including dance in higher education, she said.

"Studio work," she explained, "is mainly imitation, the emphasis being on technicalities, where as at Wisconsin there is an emphasis on understanding—on knowing what you are doing and why.

"A dance degree in education is almost imperative for teaching in an institution, although there are some 'artist-in-residence' who can teach without a degree."

Miss Gregory is one out of nine University of Wisconsin dance major graduates living and working in New York. These students, who call themselves "The Wisconsin Dance Group," meet for concerts, shows, and television performances.
