TWO HUNDRED or more high school musicians brought the University of Wisconsin's annual summer music clinic to a happy close Sunday afternoon with a thrilling concert in

the Wisconsin Union theater. After working together only three weeks, musicians and conductors produced a program of high quality which often was as brilliant as it was amazing.

In those 21 days, Victor Kolar and Stanford Hulshizer had created an orchestra and a chorus, respectively, from diverse talents and training of freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors from all over Wisconsin and from other states.

For the finale, the two organizations came together for a beautifully coordinated performance of the waltz and chorus

from "Faust.' Three of the youths-Jack Schmidt, Sheboygan; Donna Ward, Eau Claire, and Michael Birke, Sheboygan-sang solo roles with aplomb and good voices. Miss Ward's mezzo-soprano was especially warm and sure.

Other pleasant solos were sung in earlier choral numbers by David Peterson, Wittenberg, and Whilman Ladd, Dodgeville. The chorus' work in "Shenandoah," simulating the rolling river as accompaniment to Ladd's solo, was one of the program's highlights.

All through, it sang with precision and fine tone and enthusiasm. Kolar's orchestra hit its peak in the rhythmically-varied "Crimean Sketches" by Spendiarov, a tricky number in Oriental mood, and the overture to "Hansel and Gretel." It gave a good account of itself in the Schubert "Unfinished" symphony and other works, too.
