**TIP O' THE MORNING:** Watch for Jo Stafford's "Jambalaya" record to hit the best-seller list fast.

STANFORD Hulshizer proved again Tuesday night (although it wasn't necessary) that he is an accomplished and versatile choral conductor. He gave the first proof Sunday with the All-State High school chorus; the second in Music hall with the University of Wisconsin Summer Session chorus.

Hulshizer, who during the regular term conducts the Drake university choir, gave the Tuesday audience tastes of many kinds of music—simple and complex religious works, oratorio, opera, and folk music both plain and Waringized.

Two things marked his conducting above other factors—first, his superb control, giving the chorus non-mechanical precision, and second, his ability to move the organization from a feeling of great cohesion to one of contrasting timbres among the sections, and back again.

On top of these, his singers had beautiful tone and projected it well; they sang with usually admirable diction, and observed dynamics faithfully.

Diction was important, too, in the work of the two soloists, Mrs. Barbara Bennett, contralto, and James Berg, baritone.

Mrs. Bennett sang the difficult solo part in Vaughan Williams' "Magnificat," which calls for exceptional control of the voice in its unconventional and sometimes disconcerting melodic line and for unusual facility in the upper register. Mrs. Bennett came through mightily well.

Berg, less poised, nevertheless did a good job with the coronation scene from "Boris Godunow," in which the chorus reached a peak of jubilation.

Marjorie Loberg's piano accompaniment was first-rate, especially in an excerpt from Brahms' "Requiem" and the "Magnificat." In the latter, William Druckenmiller contributed expert flute playing.

**CIRCUS:** The Ringling Brothers-Barnum and Bailey circus will play seven Wisconsin cities this season, including Madison on Sunday, Aug. 31. It will not show in Milwaukee.

The circus will enter the state Aug. 25 for performances at Kenosha, then will go to Sheboygan for Aug. 26. Green Bay will see the show Aug. 27, then it will move into Michigan for one day at Menominee. Next Wisconsin stand will be Appleton, on Aug. 29, followed by Fond du Lac on Aug. 30, Madison on Aug. 31, and Beloit, on Sept. 1.

All performances will be at 2:15 and 8:15 p. m.

Sherry Abrams is the director. The company will end its season with one performance of "The Taming of the Shrew" in Madison on Monday night and Daphne DuMaurier's "September Tide" at Orchard Hill Aug. 28-31.


Mary Chase, writer of "Harvey," has arrived in New York City for rehearsals of her new comedy, "Bernardine."


