Peter Turckon, who appeared on WIBA and with Wisconsin Players while a Truax Field GI in World War II, is in the cast of "Pygmalion" at the Salt Creek Summer theater, near Hinsdale, Ill. Stars are Margaret Phillips and Dennis King.

Gene Autry will headline a charity rodeo in Denver, Colo., Oct. 16-20. He plans to complete "On Top of Old Smoky" at Columbia pictures Oct. 15, then fly to Denver.

June Allyson and Dick Powell have traded their Bel-Air home for a farm in Mandeville Canyon.

INVITATION TO DEBATE: Joseph H. McConnell, president of the National Broadcasting Co. (NBC), has offered the facilities of the radio and television networks of NBC to Gov. Adlai Stevenson and Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower for a debate on campaign issues.

In telegrams to both presidential aspirants, McConnell said: "Please be advised that radio and television networks of the National Broadcasting Co. will be available for such a debate if you decide to follow such a course. Because of widespread public interest I am sure you will have no objection to release of the text of this message." McConnell told Eisenhower and Stevenson that his decision to offer

facilities of NBC to them for a debate came after persistent press reports that such a debate was being considered. In Washington, meanwhile, Stephen Mitchell, Democratic national chairman, told reporters that he was going to discuss with Stevenson the possibility of challenging Eisenhower in a debate.
