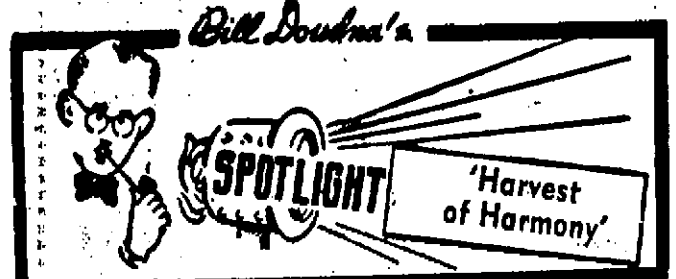


'Hawkeye Four' Coming
