**TIP OF THE MORNING:** Start of "Life Begins at 80" on WIS has been delayed a week. And it isn't scheduled on WENR.

**FRAN WILLIAM HALL**, who will present an Audubon Screen Tour on "The Four Corners" at 8 p. m. Thursday in West high school auditorium, is both a photographer and a scientist.



Since 1940—except for several years of technical work with the air force in electronic engineering—he has been head of the department of photography at Carleton college, Northfield, Minn.

For many years, he has spent summers exploring and photographing in the West. His explorations have included trips to the little known Wind River mountains of Wyoming and into the previously unexplored Dark canyon of Utah. In 1947, he and his wife were commissioned to make an official film of Colorado's Mesa Verde.

Hall also has photographed the Magdalen islands in the Gulf of the St. Lawrence and his trips to Mexico have made him an authority on the country's wild life.

**Queen Promotes Duke to No. 2 Protocol Spot**

The move—made by the Queen's warrant and announced in the official London Gazette—was seen as a preliminary to making Philip prince consort.

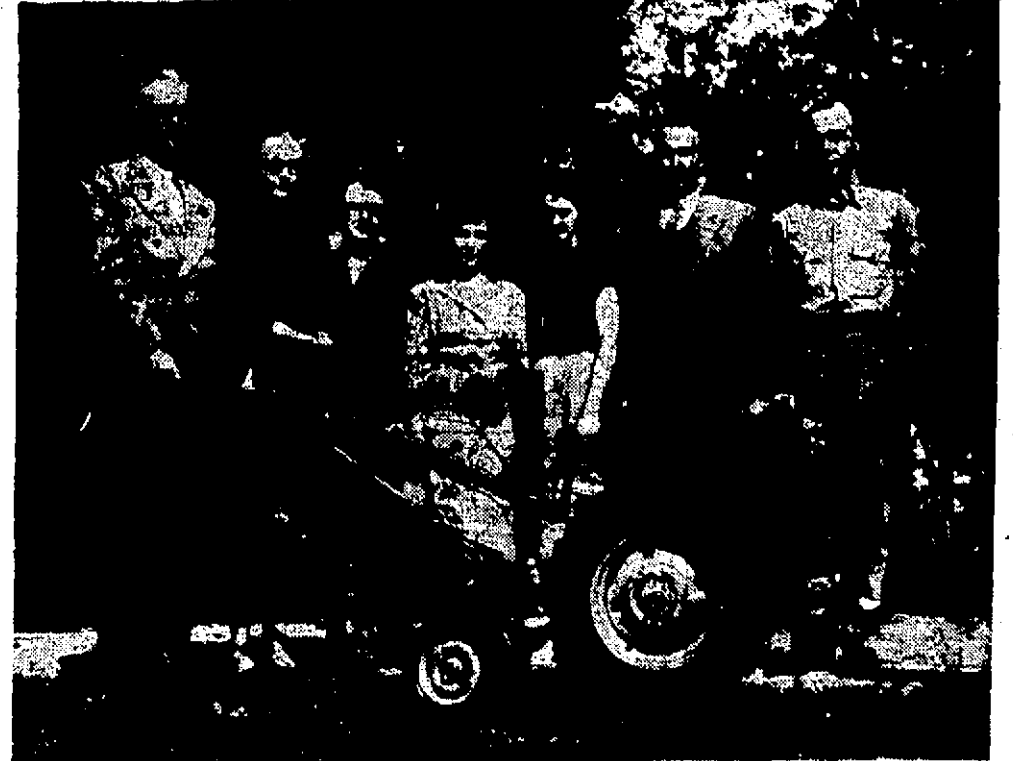

## Italian Great Debate Is Also Grape Debate

ROME (U.P.)—To peel or not to peel a grape is the basis of a current hot scientific debate, according to the Italian National Institute of Nutrition of the Council of Research.

Prof. G. Di Macco, director of the institute of general pathology of the university of Turin affirmed that the skin and pits of grapes have only scarce nutritive qualities and form indigestible material.

Prof. Carlo Foa, director of the institute of human physiology of Milan university, said Di Macco should not forget the "efficacy of the fermenting qualities of the grape skin in moderating intestinal putrefaction."

Prof. G. Bontivoglio of the university of Padua warned that "it is opportune to limit as far as possible the swallowing of seeds and peels unless they are first thoroughly masticated."

The institute said "the matter will be pursued."
