When the Milwaukee Chamber Opera Co. presents "The Marriage of Figaro" at the Milwaukee Athenaeum next week, leading roles will be played by Mrs. Joseph P. House, Jr. formerly of Madison; Suzanne Gorder, former student at the Wisconsin School of Music here, and Anna May Boerner, Ederton teacher.

Mrs. House — the former Anne Schlimgen — will sing the role of Susanna at 7:30 p. m. Friday, Oct. 17, and at 2:30 p. m. Sunday, Oct. 19. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Julian Schlimgen, she is a 1935 graduate of the University of Wisconsin. Her husband, also a Wisconsin graduate, is a Milwaukee attorney. Miss Gorder will play Barbaña at all three performances (the other will be at 7:30 p. m. Saturday, Oct. 18). Miss Boerner will portray the Countess at the Saturday presentation.

The opera will be sung in English with Milton Weber, conductor of the Waukesha Symphony orchestra, as conductor. Dr. John T. Wolmut is directing the production.

POLITICAL FORUM: Free time will be given Republican, Democratic, and independent candidates for national and state office in the Wisconsin election Nov. 4 by WHA, WLBL, and the state FM network, as was the case before the September primaries.
