

The Sunday Spotlight

Following the Primrose Path

For several reasons, one associates the name of William Primrose with Berlin's "Harold in Italy." The first is the fact that the work is scored for solo viola and orchestra, and Primrose is the best-known of violists.

More to the point, however, is the fact of two widely acclaimed performances of "Harold" with Primrose as soloist. One was his recording with the Boston Symphony orchestra under Koussevitzky, which has been a standard part of every good record library since it was issued; the second was his radio performance with Arturo Toscanini.



Now comes a recording which outshines the earlier one; this reviewer can't make a comparison with the broadcast, since bad fortune prevented his hearing it. The conductor now is Sir Thomas Beecham; the orchestra is the Royal Philharmonic, and the soloist again is Primrose.

For the first time, we have an extended example of the Beecham-Berlin combination, and it has all the qualities indicated in the conductor's shorter experiences with the composer—excepts from "The Damnation of Faust" and "Royal Hunt and Storm."

If ever there was a satisfying album, this Columbia issue is it. For the quartet of participants—Beecham, Primrose, Berlin, the engineering department—fit together as well as the quartet of Laughton, Moorhead, Boyer, Hardwicke, and Shaw in "Don Juan in Hell" (of which more at another time).

The most important thing about the playing is the delicate balance achieved in the passages in which the viola plays with the orchestra—not against it, as in the case of a concerto. And the sudden loud passages come through with equal veracity.
