TIP OF THE MORNING: The Woody Herman orchestra may do a spring tour of 60 dates with Frankie Laine.

ROBERT TOTTINGHAM, MADISON bass-baritone, has added two dates to his oratorio schedule. He will be soloist in "Elijah" with the Community Choral society at Lancaster on Dec. 4 and in "The Messiah" at Wayland academy, Beaver Dam, on Dec. 7. He had already accepted an "Elijah" date with the Milton Choral Union.

Gene Autry, Pat Buttram, and others of the troupe will be on tour during most of November and December. Only Midwestern dates are in Indiana—Terre Haute, Anderson, Ft. Wayne, and Columbus.

Claire L. Bryant, Stoughton, is a member of the Stephens College Concert chorus, which will give a 30-minute program Sunday on the Mutual network.

Victor Young has fashioned several songs from the theme music he wrote for "Blackboard the Pirate" and is in New York for conferences with recording executives.

Glenn Ford, Diana Lynn, and Patricia Medina have gone to Oaxaca, Mexico, for location scenes for "Plunder of the Sun."

Bob Crosby's "Club 15" will end a five-year radio run Jan. 16. Reason: sponsor is switching his budget to television. Howard Keel will play Wild Bill Hickok, opposite Doris Day, in Warners' "Calamity Jane."

Benny Goodman will be soloist with the Buffalo, N. Y., Symphony orchestra Nov. 15 and 16 and with the Wheeling, W. Va., Symphony orchestra Nov. 19.

GROUCHO'S ERROR: The returns from the Shakespearean authorities are in, and Groucho Marx has conceded defeat.

A few weeks ago, during his NBC comedy-quiz show, "You Bet Your Life," Groucho asked Mrs. Muriel Stetson, a 6-foot model of Rivera, Calif., and Arthur LaVove, a public relations man with Pan American Airways in Los Angeles, the following jackpot question:

"In Shakespeare's 'Henry IV,' 'Henry V,' and 'Merry Wives of Windsor' there appears a cowardly braggart whose good humor, and wit have endeared him to millions the world over. For \$1,000, I want you to identify this genial fellow."

Groucho declared the contestants wrong when they answered "Falstaff." He said that the correct answer was "Falstaff." Later, the losing couple did some research and challenged the decision. Groucho decided to put the issue before a board of five Shakespearean authorities—Laurence Olivier, Walter Hampden, Brooks Atkinson, Richard Watts, Jr., and Charles Laughton—to whom he

wrote explaining his dilemma. The experts' replies have been received, and the majority decision awards the \$1,000 prize to the contestants.

Critic Atkinson voted with Groucho. Actor Hampden gave a split decision, suggesting that the contestants get half the prize money and saying the question was confusing. Critic Watts supported the contestants, as did actor Olivier. Actor Laughton hasn't been heard from.

Turkey Boosts Duties in Reply to U. S. Hike

GENEVA, Switzerland (UP)—Turkey announced Monday increased import duties on American typewriters, washing machines, and certain other household appliances and office equipment in retaliation for the higher import duty the United States placed on dried figs.

Greece and Italy joined Turkey at a 34-nation meeting of the General Agreement on Trade and Tariffs in complaining against the increase from 2.5 cents to 4.5 cents a pound on figs but only Turkey announced retaliatory measures.

The United States delegation has promised to "review the facts."
