**DOCUMENTARIES:** A showing of three documentary films on events of World War II, at 7:30 p. m. Tuesday in 165 Bascom hall, will be open to the public. They will be screened by the University of Wisconsin history department in connection with a course on origins of the war given by Prof. Chester V. Easum.

The films are "The True Glory," which starts with the Normandy invasion and ends with the German surrender; "A Tale of Two Cities," a close-up view of the effects of atomic bombing, and "Japan Surrender," a newsreel taken on the U. S. S. Missouri.

Showing of two German films has been postponed from Dec. 9 to Dec. 16.

**MUSIC BY HOIHY:** A suite by Lee Hoiby, Madison-born composer, was given its first performance Thursday, Nov. 6, by the Rochester, N. Y., Philharmonic orchestra, with Erich Leinsdorf conducting.

It was "Hearts, Meadows, and Flags." This was the second "first performance" this fall by a major orchestra of a Hoiby composition. The first was the playing of "Noctambulation" by the NBC Symphony orchestra on Oct. 4, with Thomas Schippers conducting.

When Hoiby started "Hearts, Meadows, and Flags" in 1950, he intended it to be a ballet based on spring holidays. Then he decided to make it an orchestral suite, and revised it extensively. The work was completed in August, while Hoiby was at the MacDowell Colony. He is now in Rome on a Fulbright Fellowship, working on a one-act opera commissioned by the Curtis Institute of Music, where he had spent four years studying composition with Gian-Carlo Menotti.

Here's Hoiby's own description of the suite:

"The first movement consists of a ceremonious introduction, followed by a modified sonata form, in which the thematic material of the introduction is presented in place of the usual recapitulation and is later combined with the first theme.

"The second movement performs the function of a scherzo, although it consists of three short separate pieces (corresponding to the usual scherzo-trio-scherzo) that are not thematically related.

The third movement is in the rather formal manner of the original Maypole dance and uses two themes, first alternately and later combined.

"The fourth movement is a straight forward march, preceded by a festive introduction."
