No End to Man Shortage, Medical Group Predicts

CHICAGO @ - Warning to No less an authority than the American Medical Association says that "the worst is yet to come" in the man shortage.

The AMA brooded editorially in its journal Thursday that "according to present indications, the preponderance of women will continue to grow, with attendant in-crease in widowhood and depen-

dency."

The 1950 census showed that the state of the sta the ANA said, is in the age groups over 45 years, where women outnumber men 1,000 to 956.

The AMA said the chief reason for this sorry state of affairs is the higher death rate of males.

In 1930 the ratio was 1,210 deaths in men to 1,000 in women.

In 1951 the ratio had jumped to 1333 men to 1,000 women.

That isn't all.

The AMA said that in recent years more women than men have migrated to this country, while more men have left the United States to live elsewhere.

It said that in the five years after the end of World War II migration produced a net sain of

nigration produced a net gain of 181.500 women, over men.

And, finally, war deaths have widened the gap between the male and female populations, the AMA

said.
"The present indications are that this excess will become even larger in the future," the editorial said gloomily.
