CHICAGO (n-Dr. Andrew C. Ivy. whose disclosure of a new cancer drug produced a storm in the medical world, said Friday that about 70 per cent of 500 cancer patients treated with the drug benefited from it. Ivy released a bulky report on two years of research with the controversial drug "Krebiozen," which was his answer to critics who have said it has no value.

Published in Paper The report was released through the Krebiozen Research Foundation, Inc. of which Ivy formerly was president, after a Chicago newspaper published its contents. Ivy said medical publication of the report had been planned, but that after the newspaper published it he felt everyone should "get an even hreak."

Taking note of the divergent opinions of Krebjozen's value, Ivy said that "if possible, I want to set up a strictly scientifically-controlled study to determine which of the two clinical views is correct."

The American Medical Associa-tion (AMA) earlier announced a study by its own experts which claimed to find little of value in Krebiozen.

Last week George Stoddard, president of the University of Illinois termed the drug "valueless" and forbade any further research by Ivy or other members of the university staff.

The foundation said the Ivy report was based on about 500 cases as studied by 232 doctors in 150 clinics and hospitals throughout the country.

It said "symptoms were ameli-orated" in 70 per cent of the cases observed and that hardening or swelling of the cancer tumor also was "decreased" in 70 per cent of the patients.

The cancer tumor or its second-ary growth was decreased in size in about 50 per cent of cases, the eport said.
