JULIE AND Juliette Gerke, twin duo-pianists, will join Gunnar Johansen on his "Bach Commemorative Concert" over WBA and the state FM network at 3:30 p. m. today. They will play Bach's "Trio Sonata No. 1."

The Madison girls are students at the University of Wisconsin, where Johansen is professor of music. Today's performance will be the first of six trio sonatas to be played on the series. Johansen is the regular pianist and commentator for these programs, which are designed to show the growth of Bach as a composer through his keyboard music.

REVIEWER: Warren R. Jollymore. STORY: The lives, loves, and hardships of the Pilgrims during their crossing on the Mayflower to the New World and the effect it all had on Captain Christopher Jones, rugged master of the Pilgrim ship.

HIGH POINTS: Spencer Tracy's portrayal of the hard-bitten sea captain... the casting is superb, as each name drops onto the sound track from the pages of American history, it seems to fit wonderfully the actor or actress selected for it... the ocean storm scene, the wildness of the sea when it is enraged is convincingly portrayed... the lesson the movie has for all who would accept it—that faith and tolerance and goodness, not hatred, intolerance, and violence, are the stepping stones to the accomplishment of greatness... and the color by Technicolor, terrific as usual.

LOW POINTS: The thread of treachery by selfish English companies which is woven through the movie is somewhat vague... the plot jerks along in spots... the Sunday-go-meetin' clothes worn by the pilgrim weathered the treacherous trip too well for solid realism.

EXTRAS: Excellent shorts, including a newsreel in which Wisconsin's pride and joy, Alan (The Horse) Ameche, is selected as Movietone's All-American fullback... and a special Plymouth Adventure contest giving movie-goers a chance to win a sewing machine or other prizes.

VERDICT: Very good. And there's a chance to take something real worth while home with you—in your heart.
