Conductor Walter Heermann had chosen for this third annual youth concert a program of music particularly appealing to boys and girls, with something for every age group.

In effect, it was an informal lesson in music appreciation, showing such things as the unique tone qualities of solo instruments, the way a composer can transform and enhance a simple melody...

There was cause for pride, too, in the almost all-city cast of dancers and musicians. Three of the soloists were products of Madison schools, as were all the dancers and many of the orchestra members.

For the youngest set, the dancing was the high point of the program. Miss Hubbard's originality and careful training showed in every portion of this part of the concert.

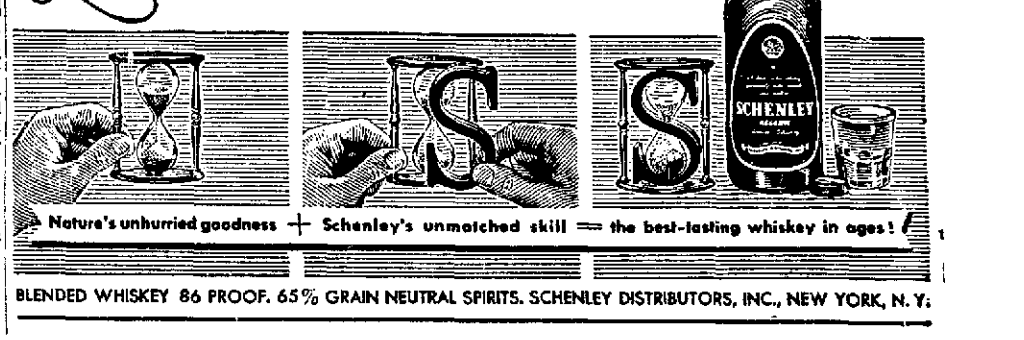
HER DAILY CHORE
