

Declarer won with the ace of hearts and entered dummy with the king of clubs in order to return a low diamond. The plan was to finesse the nine from his lown hand and thus develop the suit without giving East the lead.

Unfortunately for declarer, East put up the jack of diamonds and subsequently won the third round of that suit. A heart continuation then gave the defenders three tricks in that suit to defeat the contract.
