"BLUE TANGO," BY LEROY Anderson was 1952's most popular song, year-end ratings to be published today by Billboard magazine will show.

The ratings were based on the Billboard's weekly "Honor Roll of Hits," determined by a scientific tabulation of each song's popularity according to sheet music sales, retail record sales, juke-box play, disc jockey use, and performances in films and on network broadcasts.

Anderson's own recording of "Blue Tango" was the best-selling popular disc of the year in retail stores, the Billboard also will report. "Wild Side of Life," recorded by Hank Thompson, led in the country-and-Western division, and Lloyd Price's "Lawdy Miss Clawdy" in the rhythm-and-blue division. The over-all tabulation shows these songs following "Blue Tango" in this order:
