

### Alert UN Troops Stand By After Reds Yow Attack

TOKYO (UP) — United Nations fighting men stood alertly by their tuns and lobbed an occasional shell into Red lines today as they waited to see if the Communists meant business with their threats of a New Year offensive.

A freezing cold, lonely New Year's Eve was in prospect for front-line troops. It will be the third of the Korean War but the third of the Korean war but the first in the line for most combat home.
