



# JACOBY ON By Oswald Jacoby

When today's hand was played, South happened to be a confirmed overbidder. He had made a reso-lution to tid more conservatively, and he had kept this resolution for

a short time. But when this hand came along he could bear the restraint no longer. He simply couldn't see himself playing the South hand for

less than a slam.

Just put yoursel! in South's seat.

You have bid the hand to the hilt, or perhaps a little farther, and you are now playing the hand at a contract of six hearts. You win the first trick with the king of diamends, and it is now up to you to plan the rest of the hand. How would you go about it? begin by laying down the

ace of trumps, and each opponent follows suit. Don't be too quick about your next play. At the third trick your best play

is to lead a low spade from your hand. East wins and returns a trump, which you take with the king of hearts. Now you lead the queen of clubs and overtake with dummy's king, since you must get to dummy for the spade finesse. to dummy for the spade finesse

When the queen of spades holds, you can breathe a sigh of relief. You are still not out of the woods,

This play is perfectly safe if each opponent has three spades. If the spades are 4-2, however, your only hope is that the player with the fewr spades is the same defender who has the last trump.

This is actually the case, and West must make a futlle discard, while East follows suit. Now you can ruff your last spade with dum
