

Vaughn Monroe

TIP O' THE MORNING: Gabriel di Pazzo, Milwaukee pianist, and Margaret Fitzgerald, Wauwatosa soprano, will appear on "Youth Brings You Music" (NBC-WIBA) Sunday afternoon.

VAUGHN MONROE PACKED a lot of entertainment into the two-hour show which he presented twice Monday night at the Parkway theater.

This singing band-leader has mastered one art which more of them should practice—he kept the show moving along with a minimum of talk from himself. In addition, he did no wise-cracking, self-praise, nor plugging for his radio sponsor.

With the exception of a new mixed quartet, the company was much the same as in other years. The Moonbeams, two boys and two girls, have replaced the Moon Maids; the Moon Men were still on hand, and often joined the mixed group in choruses.

The girls' quartet broke up during Christmas week, when Marie Lee, who had been in the Monroe Caravan 10 years, and Lois Wilber, the baby of the group, became brides. Replacing them were Maurie and Dee Law, Kevin Cayon, and Katie Cairns. Some awkwardness in staging and occasional lack of balance in the singing which were apparent Monday night probably will be remedied as the new singles become used to the act.

Top soloists were Richard LaSalla, who played "Trumpeter's Lullaby" with tone approaching that of a cornet; Andrew Bagui, on alto sax in "Invitation"; and Ziggy Talent, who did his inimitable "Maharajah of Magidor," "Josephine, Do Not Lean on the Bell," and a new comedy number, "Vitaminus."

Drummer Eddie Julian was the center of a comedy bit which closed the first half. This routine, too, needs jelling before it is as funny as it could be.

The untiring Monroe sang, conducted, and played trumpet and trombone.

Non-musical acts were Roy Benson's riotously funny magic and Jake Kirk's sometimes funny combination of monolog, acrobatics, and dancing.

The 14-piece band was, as usual, first-rate playing arrangements of varied type with precision, style, and vigor. Its long production numbers were interesting musically and good listening, too.

Visiting backstage, Monroe recalled his first trip to Madison in 1926. He came from Cudahy with the high school band and orchestra for a state festival, and took a first place with his trumpet.

"I think that was the first time I was ever on a train," he said. Of all his musical career, which has brought him to the top rank in record sales and personal-appearance popularity, Monroe recalled a boyhood event as the most exciting single thing.

"John Philip Sousa brought his band to Milwaukee," he said, "and all the high school bands in the Milwaukee area went to greet him. We Cudahy boys were lucky—we marched right behind him.

"But the big moment came when Sousa took a baton and conducted our band. That I'll never forget."
