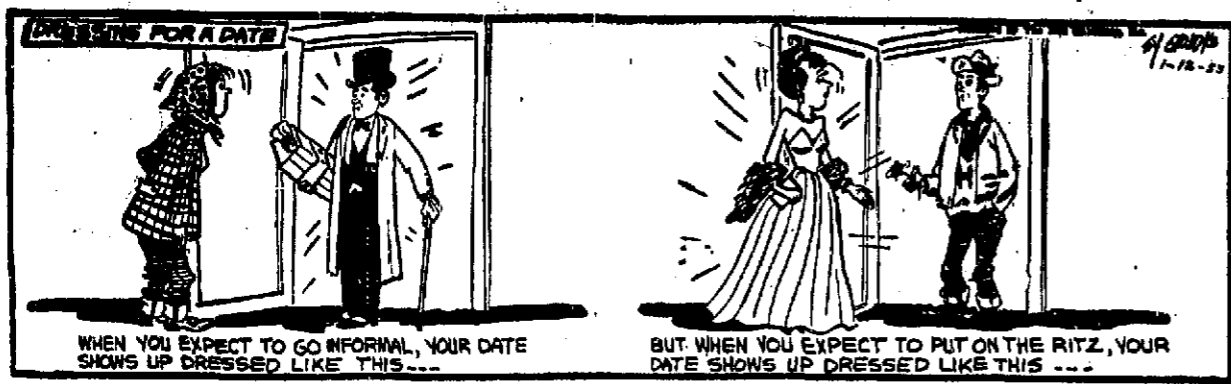

Budget Review Set Immediately

House Group Won't Wait on Eisenhower

WASHINGTON (UP)—Rep. John Taber said Sunday his economy-bent House Appropriations Committee will start reviewing President Truman's \$78,600,000,000 budget without waiting for suggestions from the new Eisenhower administration.

Has Noted 'Holes'
The New York Republican said he already has noted "holes" in Truman's budget for the 12 months beginning next July 1 that might lead to cuts of as much as \$15,000,000,000.

Sen. Styles Bridges (R-N.H.), who will head the Senate Appropriations Committee, predicted on a radio program that the Republicans will balance the budget, and stop "reckless spending."

Kefauver Wants Balance
Sen. Estes Kefauver (D-Tenn.) said he also hopes the budget will be balanced. But he predicted the GOP will find it difficult to cut Truman's spending figure.
