**Court Here Gets New Cheese Patent Suit**

Madison Federal Court had another cheese patent suit on its hands Thursday when Chain O' Lakes, Inc. of Waupaca, demanded an injunction, an accounting, and treble damages of \$36,000 from Blue Moon Foods, Inc. of Thorp. The complaint charged that Blue Moon Foods, while patent was pending, gained fraudulent access to a trade secret involving apparatus and processes in making small cheeses.

The trade secret, it claims, was perfected by Carl and Marvin L. Cohen, owners of Chain O' Lakes. Its patent for making 1 1/2 g. Longhorn cheeses was granted in March, 1952.
