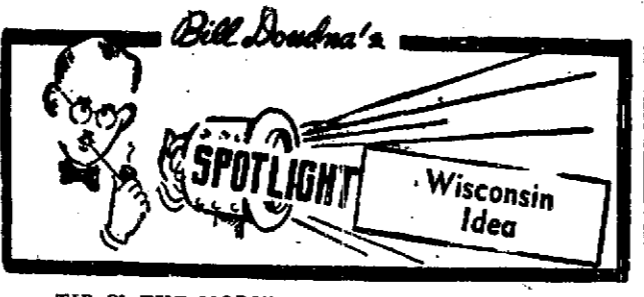

PROF. JONATHAN CURVIN'S lucid explanation of the difficulties which beset the men who adapted "Billy Budd, Foretopman" for the stage leads off the winter issue of the Wisconsin Idea, magazine published on the University of Wisconsin campus.



One of those difficulties was similar to that faced by those who put "The Snows of Kilimanjaro" on the screen. Just as the Hemingway work was a short story, so "Billy Budd, Foretopman" was a novelette—and the adapters had to expand them, rather than contract, as in the case of most adaptations. Curvin doesn't make this point in so many words, but it is implicit in his account of the work of Louis O. Coxe and Robert Chapman, who compromised between nautical melodrama and "the elusive symbolism" of the story, and did so "with an intelligence and practical-mindedness rare among even experienced playwrights."

Another extended article in the Wisconsin Idea is Richard Leeman's "The Braekish Pond of Campus Writing," a critical survey of the autumn issue of the magazine. Leeman finds that most of the student writing is "inverted romanticism", in which the writer feels and records "experience in terms of the sordid and thwarting, the biological and mechanical." He calls the work "naive rebellion," approximating in its delineation of character "a labored clinical study—psychology unrelated to idea and vision." He also bemoans "an almost total insulation from the lessons of past and present writers." Leeman's report is hampered by a basketful of typographical errors, more regrettable in a magazine of the Idea's kind than in any other periodical. For that matter, the typographic approach as a whole is one of heterogeneity—and that's not good, either.
