SPOTLIGHT Art Show

TIP O' THE MORNING: Margaret Whiting, vocalist on Bob Hope's NBC show, is expected to have her own CBS program soon.

PRIZES totaling \$560 will be awarded at the 14th annual Madison Artists' exhibition, which the Madison Art assn. will sponsor Feb. 7 through 27 at Scanlan hall.

Entry blanks have been mailed, but artists who didn't receive them can get them from the gallery chairman, Mrs. William K. Ackerman, 1005 Grant st.

Among the major awards will be The Wisconsin State Journal award in graphics, the Frances K. Marschall award, the Catherine Head Coleman award, the Oscar F. Mayer purchase prize, the Madison Bank and Trust Co. award, the Harry S. Manchester award in water color, and the Joe Rothschild award in sculpture or ceramics.

Each artist may submit two entries in oil and tempera, water color and pastel, graphics (including drawings), sculpture, and ceramics. Entries will be received from 4 to 9 p. m. Thursday, Feb. 5, at Scanlan hall. The show will open Saturday night, Feb. 7, with a reception for the artists and association members, and will be open to the public thereafter.

H. Harvard Arnason of the Walker Art center, Minneapolis, Minn., will be the judge.

After a seven-year absence, Victor Moore will return to Broadway on Feb. 10 in a revival of Paul Osborn's "On Borrowed Time." Also in the cast will be Leo G. Carroll and Beulah Bondi.

Brandon DeWilde, 10-year-old actor, will be in "The Emperor's New Clothes" when that play opens Feb. 9 at New York's Barrymore theater.

Emlyn Williams, who will be at the Wisconsin Union theater Feb. 13, will begin his 43-city tour tonight in Summit, N. J.

When Lanny Ross gave a recital last weekend at New York's Town Hall, "the audience was startled to hear the refrain of 'Shenandoah' taken up by a group of boys seated in the parquet," the New York Times reported. They were from the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, where Ross was a boy soprano 32 years ago.

Eugene Conley will have the leading role in Stravinsky's "The Rake's Progress" when the first American performance is given Feb. 14 in the Metropolitan Opera House. Others in the cast will be Mack Harrell, Hilde Gueden, and Blanche Thebom.

Frank Sinatra will play Maggio in the movie version of "From Here to Eternity." Montgomery Clift will play Pruit, Burt Lancaster will be Sgt. Warden, and Deborah Kerr will portray Karen Holmes. Sinatra's only other dramatic role in pictures was as a priest in "The Miracle of the Bells" five years ago.

MGM will film a sequel to "The Bad and the Beautiful" with the same cast.

Albert Spalding, American violinist, is the author of "A Fiddle, a Sword, and a Lady," romantic novel to be published in March.
