

**TIP O' THE MORNING:** The WLS "Dinner Bell" program will be broadcast Thursday, Feb. 5, from Wisconsin Farm and Home Week on the University of Wisconsin campus.

**SCULPTURE:** Humbert Albriizio, who joined the University of Wisconsin's art education faculty last fall, won an honorable mention in sculpture at the 148th Annual Exhibition of Contemporary American Oil Painting and Sculpture which opened Saturday night at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts, Philadelphia.

Other Wisconsin artists represented in the show are John Wilde, Evansville, also a member of the art education faculty; Elwyn Chamberlain, Madison; and Fred Berman, Milwaukee.

Wilde, by the way, was the subject of a full-page article in Newsweek magazine last week. It included reproductions of two of his works now on exhibition in New York City.

**NAMES IN THE NEWS:** Five buildings designed by Frank Lloyd Wright are among 43 selected by the Museum of Modern Art as "the most significant examples of modern architecture built in this country since 1945" for a current exhibition, "Built in U. S. A. — Post-War Architecture."

They are Johnson Wax Co.'s helio-laboratory at Racine; the V. C. Morris store, San Francisco; the Herbert Jacobs house, near Middleton; the Friedman house, Pleasantville, N. Y.; and the Wayfarers' chapel, Palos Verdes, Calif.

Vincent Price will have a starring role in "Son of Sinbad," to be produced by RKO Radio Pictures. He will play Omar, the tentmaker.

Burt Lancaster and Virginia Mayo will be teamed again in "Sulu Sea," a film romance of the South Pacific.

Bert Parks has taken over the quizmaster duties on "Double or Nothing," heard on WIBA at 9:30 a. m. Monday through Friday.

Donald Gramma, Milwaukee-horn baritone, will sing the leading role in the world premiere of Bohuslav Martinu's opera, "The Marriage," over the NBC television network Saturday, Feb. 7.
