'Papa Is All'

TIP OF THE MORNING: All ABC programs today will salute "The Lone Ranger" and its 20th birthday.

MARJORIE SCHAFFER took over the leading role in "Papa Is All" for the Madison Theater Guild less than a week before its opening, and Thursday night turned in a performance which ranks with the best anyone in that organization has given.

It was a long part—Miss Schaffer was on stage during most of the play. In addition, it was a dialect role, for "Papa Is All" is a comedy about the so-called Pennsylvania Dutch, filled with the unusual turns of speech familiar in Wisconsin as Milwaukee-talk or Sheboyganese.

The title is a sample, since "Papa Is All" means that Papa is all gone—in this case, dead.

Like Miss Schaffer, Jack Yocum stepped into his role with limited time. The audience, at West high school found him sufficiently brutal as the Papa who was feared by all his family and despised by his children and by his neighbors.

But the play was largely Miss Schaffer's. She gave Mama the sympathy of the audience in her attempts to outwit the man who thought of himself as a hand of God, and to protect her son and daughter. It was her consummate feeling for the role and for its dialect which, more than anything else, turned the play's grimness into smooth and often hilarious comedy.

Essentially, the story was simple: Papa's son, Jake, decided to do something about the tyrant, and when he came home with the word that Papa was dead, everybody brightened and set out to get the things Papa had denied the household, including a young man for daughter Emma.

Stan Spencer and Vergenne Fesshage gave good performances as the children, and Mae Merriman contributed a memorable vignette as a gossip neighbor. John Barsness completed the cast as a state trooper. Al Barracough directed the play and designed the simple but graphic setting.

The play will be repeated at 8:15 tonight at West and at 8:15 p. m. Saturday at East high school.

Barracough announced that the cast for the arena production of "Dangerous Corner" Feb. 19-21 will consist of Lou Dorlag, Agatha Church, Joseph Klein, Ray Lenahan, Jeanne Remus Neher, and Miss Schaffer.

PROTEST: The radio program "Gangbusters" has been banned from the Sullivster (Minn.) state prison radio system because the prisoners don't like it, Warden Leo Utecht said Thursday.

"You can see where you are going with humans," he comments. Some statistics on "Peter Pan" back up Disney's contention.
