

TIP OF THE MORNING: "The Halls of Ivy" may never return to radio. Its creator, Don Quinn, is reported negotiating on a television show of an entirely different program.

ERNST AND MARIE Friedlander will celebrate their 10th year in Madison with a recital at 8 p.m. Sunday in Music Hall. This also is Friedlander's 10th anniversary as cellist with the Pro Arte quartet.

Two "firsts" will be on their program—the first American performance of Roger's "Sonata, Opus 5, for Cello and Piano" and the first Madison playing of Krenek's "Sonata for Cello (alone), Opus 54."

Both the Friedlanders were born in Vienna, and met there while Mrs. Friedlander was studying piano with the cellist's sister.

Before coming to Madison, Friedlander had been first cellist of the Vienna Concert orchestra, a member of the Popa-Grama quartet in Austria, principal cellist with the Indianapolis Symphony and Kansas City Philharmonic orchestras, and active as a soloist.

He made his New York debut as a concert cellist shortly before joining the Pro Arte quartet.

City Man Gets Year in Prison

Robert R. Rutledge, 23, of 202 King st., was sentenced to one year in Wausau state prison Monday in Superior Court for failing to return to the county jail after he was released under the Huber law to work Christmas day.

Rutledge was found Friday night at an isolated farm near Warrens (Monroe county) where he said he had been hired to cut wood since leaving the jail. Although the State st. restaurant where he had been employed under the Huber law was closed on Christmas day, Rutledge said neither former Sheriff Herman Kerl nor any of the jail employees questioned his leaving the jail that day under the pretense that he was going to work.

He said he just "bummed" around all day and overslept at a friend's house, so he decided to "just keep going" rather than return to the jail late.

Rutledge was sentenced Oct. 23 to nine months in jail for contributing to the delinquency of a 17-year-old Blooming Grove girl.

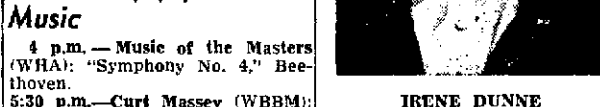
