

**SPOTLIGHT** Nathaniel Shilkret

**TIP OF THE MORNING:** A chapter of the American Guild of Organists may be organized here. Many Madison and area organists have indicated an interest in such a move.

**NATHANIEL SHILKRET**, musical director of Cornelia Otis Skinner's solo revue, "Paris '90," is reputed to have recorded more than 30,000 selections during his 20 years with Victor records.



He began his career when he was 6, playing both piano and clarinet. At 9, he was soloist with a famous New York boys' orchestra, and at 12 he joined Victor Herbert's orchestra.

In the next eight years, Shilkret played with the New York Philharmonic, the New York Symphony, and the Metropolitan Opera orchestras. And at 20 he became Victor's musical director.

Besides that, Shilkret managed the company's foreign department for a time and was manager of his popular music department for 12 years. Then he went into radio, and for 14 years conducted an average of 10 commercial programs a week.

His career also has included composition, research in folk music which led to a doctorate, and guest conducting with symphony orchestras.

With Miss Skinner's company, he will conduct the 23 musical numbers which mark the one-woman revue to be seen the night of Feb. 23 at the Parkway theater.
