



TIP O' THE MORNING: Talk about summer replacements has already started on Radio Row. First deal reported in the making is with Guy Lombardo as Jack Benny's substitute.

ONE of the season's most important musical events will be broadcast at 1 p. m. Saturday over WISC and WISC-FM.

It is the American premiere of Igor Stravinsky's opera, "The Rake's Progress," performed in the Metropolitan Opera house.

Two of the leading roles will be sung by artists who have been in Madison on the Wisconsin Union concert series—Mack Harrell, baritone, in 1951 and Blanche Theobald, mezzo-soprano in 1952.

Eugene Conley, Norman Scott, Hilde Gueden, Martha Lipton, Paul Franke, and Lawrence Davidson will complete the cast. Fritz Renter will conduct.

The idea for the opera in English came to Stravinsky five years ago when he saw Hogarth's "Rake's Progress" etchings in an exhibition. They looked to him like a series of scenes from an opera.

The composer mentioned the idea to Aldous Huxley, who suggested that he call on W. H. Auden, the poet, for the libretto, which he did.
