Choir Music and Madison Art

By WILLIAM L. DOUDNA Wisconsin church choirs are the beneficiaries of a service which is probably unique. Without any charge at all, they can use the resources of the Louis Fletcher Library—its anthems, organ solos, and recordings.

The library was established by the Wisconsin Association of Church Musicians as a continuing tribute to one of its founders, its basis was Mrs. Fletcher's own collection of organ music, to which were added contributions by Wini-Fred Ryan, former Madison organist, and the association's gifts.

This music the association lends without charge. And the bureau of information and program services of the University of Wisconsin administers it and handles the request for use without charge.

Since the library was established in 1940, the association has donated music worth more than \$700. Last year alone, its contribution was \$200 worth—17 anthems with 45 copies of each, 23 organ solos, seven albums of organ selections, and five numbers for organ or piano.

This brought the library's collection to 59 sets of anthems, with from 30 to 45 copies each for choir use, 207 organ solos, and 80 albums of organ music.

Music going into the library has been selected carefully with an ear for quality and an eye for the needs of the state's church choirs. Mrs. Ruth Pilger Andrews, Madison, chose the organ numbers. Matthias Cooper, Madison, selected the choir music with the assistance of Prof. Leon Lewis of the university music school and Mrs. Marjory Lewis, Lodi.

Choir works range from Palestrina to contemporary composers, and from simple pieces for small groups to difficult ones for large choirs. For organ, there are difficult concert selections and easy arrangements for harmonium, and much in between.

Most of the money spent by the association was raised through its annual Choir Festivals. Such a festival will be held Sunday, March 1, in Luther Memorial church, with a massed choir of more than 300 singers taking part. This will be the sixth festival; its purpose will be largely to add to the library fund.

At the same time, it will acquaint both singers, and listeners (the public is invited with music new to them and will be a means of spiritual uplift.

To know of the library's success, one need only ask Gladys Dieruf, its librarian. Not only has she received many letters of thanks and appreciation from choirs and organists, but she has seen the time that the collection was put to such great use that its shelves were almost empty.

If you want to see what Madison's artists are doing, take a trip to Scanlan hall in the Vocational and Adult school. There you will see 97 samples in the annual Madison Artists exhibition, sponsored by the Madison Art assn.

There are 34 paintings in oil, tempera, and encaustic; 21 water colors; 27 graphics, including drawings, and 15 examples of sculpture and ceramic art.

These were chosen from among 182 entries by 93 artists, the second largest number in the two years in which entrants have been limited to two pieces each.

Because of Scanlan hall's larger exhibit area, the shows which have been held there since 1951 have been larger than those in the Madison Free library galleries in other years.

Besides Madison, the artists live in Appleton, Janesville, Lodi, Waunakee, McFarland, Okeo, Des Moines, Ia., and San Francisco, Calif.

Entries were limited to residents of Dane county and members of the Madison Art assn. The second half of the exhibition explains the outside activities—for Bob Hodgler, Des Moines, and Ted Wolf, San Francisco, have retained their interest in the event, and their memberships in the association.

Luzon Natives Remain Wild

The island of Luzon is the largest of all the islands in the Philippine group. The southern part of it contains the big city of Manila, and is settled fairly thickly, but the northern half has few persons to the square mile.

In the northern part, scattered about hills and mountains, live the half-savage members of the Igorot (pronounced "e-go-ROTE").

Despite the work of civilization which has gone on during the present century, these people keep up some of their old ways.

The Igorots live in simple thatched houses. They raise a few crops (especially rice) but many of the men spend most of their time hunting. They carry axes and spears as weapons.

Have Strange Beliefs Close to the edge of an Igorot village, a visitor may be shown a "spirit tree." It is supposed that after a person dies in the village, his soul is likely to spend some time in and about this tree.

That is only one of the beliefs of these people concerning spirits. They also speak of a home of the dead under the ground, and of a

place high in the sky where the spirits of warriors go if they die while fighting in battle. Their chief, King Lumawig, is said to be the host of the hero spirits.

It is common for Igorots to be tattooed. The most popular tattoo mark is a blue image of the sun on the back of the hand.

Carry Heavy Loads Both the men and the women in Igorot tribes carry heavy loads. The men wear harnesses of a sort to hold the loads on their backs.

A woman may carry a loaded basket two feet high on her head, or an one of her shoulders. A braided rawhide strap passes around the woman's forehead, and is employed to hold the basket in place.

Evil spirits are feared by the Igorots. When a man goes out into a field, he is likely to carry a devil stick with him, in addition to his spear, and perhaps an ax. The devil stick is a piece of bamboo about 18 inches long.

It has holes which are something like the holes of a flute. When the stick is whacked against the hunter's thigh, it gives forth a musical note, and this is expected to drive

the hill devils away. Until the early part of the present century, the Igorots followed the horrible custom of slaying enemies and cutting off their heads. A young warrior might try to make himself a hero, of a bad kind, by gathering several heads. While the American government was in control of the Philippines, the officials stamped out the head-hunting custom. Today we may see a group of warriors take part in the old head-hunting dance, but no longer do they dance around a human head.

Guppy, Not Birds, Bees Is Best Haven

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (U.P.)—Dr. Leon Whitney, Yale pathologist, has suggested that the "immortal" guppy, not the bird or the bee, is better for teaching the facts of life to children than the birds and bees.

Whitney said thousands of children learn their first facts of life from their tank guppies. He said the aquarium in which they live might be described as a submarine delivery room.
