GUNNAR JOHANSEN'S vir-Minneapolis Symphony orches-tra were combined Sunday afternoon, under the brilliant conducting of Antal Dorati, to sum up the music of Maurice Ravel. The composer had told a friend that in this piano concerto (in G major) he had expressed himself most completely.

And so it would seem, for in places it was as shimmering as

The graceful second movement, however, was the most revealing of his and Dorati's musical integrity, both in the quiet opening candilena and the decorations with which the plano developed it, while the orchestra was taking over the theme with a touch of mysticism.
