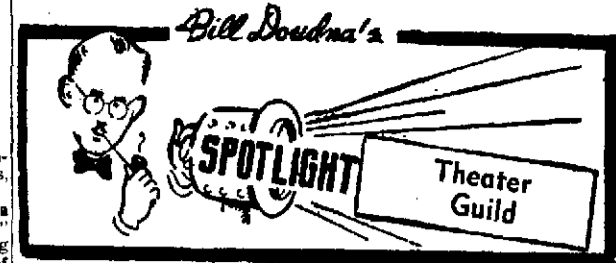

SOME of the departures and problems of the theater-in-the-round production of "Dangerous Corner" by the Madison Theater Guild, which opens Wednesday night at Scanlan hall, are detailed by a member of the organization... like this:
"As it will be produced arena-style, viewers will be on all four sides of the acting area."
"No platform will be used, the 18 by 22 foot playing area being right at audience level. There will be only four rows of seats on any level, and these will be staggered to allow perfect viewing. The illusion of having a seat right on the stage of a play is almost complete."
"One set will be used, and there will be no curtains. The stage will be lit from poles in the back, using only spot lights. The sound and light control board will be erected in the rear."
"The spotlights would cause players' faces to appear very white, but the proximity of the audience will allow only the use of subtle make-up, so pancake make-up will be used instead of the usual theatrical make-up."
"The cast will be all in evening dress, and there will be no change of costumes."

AT THE UNION: Collages by William Harris will be on exhibition in the Wisconsin Union theater gallery starting Wednesday. The show will be sponsored by the Union gallery committee, whose chairman is Gwyn Thomas Ricketts, Madison.
A collage is described by Harris as "painting with paper."
"There doesn't seem to be any English word to describe this method of making pictures," he adds. The word collage was originally of French origin and was a paper-hangers' term meaning to plaste or glue.
French artists started creating pictures with bits of paper, wood and newspaper. Harris goes a step farther, using anything that strikes his fancy — old prints found in bookstores, pieces of burlap, drift

wood, and cigar bands.
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"People sometimes ask me why I don't do a collage and then copy it in a painting. I don't see any reason for this. What difference does it make if I do a picture in oil paint or chewing gum? It is not what you use, it's the result that matters. Any picture should please the eye and stimulate the imagination."
Harris' collages will be on view through March 15.
