Brailowsky's approach to his audience was shy and modest, but his output was something entirely different, a vigorous and bold performance punctuated by pieces quiet and delicate. Even his posture—a sort of crouch over the keyboard — was deceptive, for it gave him an appearance of slightness, hardly capable of the thunderous music he sometimes produced.

His program was daring, in one sense, for it consisted almost entirely of works familiar to concert goers, who thus would be quick to make comparisons with other pianists. The daring paid off, because any comparison would come out in Brailowsky's favor through his ability to give the listener some things he hadn't heard before.

He began with the Bach-Busoni "Chaconne," itself a challenge to virtuosity since Busoni was one of history's great plano techniclans.

virtuosity since Busoni was one of history's great piano technicians. With it, Brailowsky immediately gained the audience's high regard. Then he switched to the gentleness and frolicking of Scarlaiti's "Pastorale and Capriccio," followed by the enchanting pictures of Schumann's "Carnaval."

The second half was devoted to Debussy, Ravel, and Chopin, He played the Debussy "Gardens in the Rain" and "La Plus que Lente" with great charm, the Ravel "Toccate" with polgnancy.




