



Bill Doudna's Spotlight

TIP O' THE MORNING: Dina Shore will star in a new WIBA program to be heard Monday and Friday nights starting March 23.

A MEMORABLE performance of Brahms' "Piano Quartet in C Minor" marked a Sunday night concert in Music Hall by Leo Steffens, pianist, and three members of the Pro Arte quartet — Rudolph Kolisch, Bernard Milofsky, and Ernst Friedlaender.

In this case, as seldom happens at these concerts, it was the individual work of the artists rather than the ensemble effect which made the greatest impression. When ensemble effort was needed, however, it was always there.

The quartet was garnished with beautiful solo passages, and two of these were outstanding — one for cello at the beginning of the third movement; one for violin — with a running commentary from the piano — in the finale. Besides these, there were the impassioned serenades of the opening movement and the stormy orchestral effects of the scherzo.

Greatest advance interest in the program was centered on Ernst Toch's "Trio for Strings," its first Madison performance. It had many examples of ingenuity and original thinking, periods of dynamic power especially in the first movement, a sonorous and suspenseful adagio, and a finale of high spirits and a rush of activity. Toch used repetition of ideas to great advantage to heighten the effects he appeared to be seeking. One passage lingers in the mind — a statement of melody by Milofsky, overlaid with decoration by Kolisch, and emphasized by Friedlaender's pizzicato.

The concert opened with Beethoven's "Trio in G Major," also for violin, viola, and cello, a contemplative work in which the final presto seemed to be a feverish attempt to allay the sadness the piece had built up.

Vishinsky Talk Eyed for Word on Korea

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—Two Soviet satellites have reserved spots to speak on Korea today in the United Nations. But Russia's Andrei Y. Vishinsky may step forward at the last minute to relay the latest word from the Kremlin. If Vishinsky speaks up, diplomats will be looking not only for some "give" on a Korean truce, but also for possible follow-ups to persistent Soviet leaders for an Eisenhower-Stalin meeting. The schedule for today has Communist Czechoslovakia heading the speakers list for the morning and Communist Poland listed for the afternoon.
